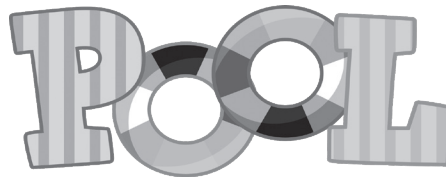

Dog licenses due in June

Dog Licenses are due in June. All dogs inside and outside must be licensed. The fees are \$2 for males and spayed females and \$4 for unsplayed females. You must bring in proof of current rabies shot at the time of licensing. If you do not get your dog(s) licensed, the Village Marshal may charge you with having an unlicensed dog. If

the occasion should arise, you could incur a fine of up to \$100, plus court costs of \$41.50.

Also, as you walk your dog around town, please be courteous to others and pick up fecal matter from your dog. Free waste bags are available at the Village Hall. Thank you for your cooperation.

Tips for safe social networking

Facebook, MySpace, LinkedIn, Twitter, MeetUp, blogs, etc. The number of social networking sites are growing. Social networks are popular among the criminals too. They search the sites for information to steal your identity or burglarize your home. So how do you safeguard against this? Here are three tips:

1. **NEVER SHARE:** Social Security Number, your birth date, home address, or home phone number, any pass words or PIN Numbers, bank account and credit card information. Or even the state you were born (if they

know the state you were born, it is possible for someone to get your social security number or even a copy of your birth certificate).

2. Limit work history details. If you post your full resume, it makes it easy for identity thieves to use the information to fill out loan applications.

3. Posting that you're going on vacation or attending a certain event is an open invitation for your home to be burglarized. Instead post your vacation photos or comments about the event you attended, after you return home.

Trees disposal info

Tree disposal is available Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m.-8 p.m.

ONLY TREES, LEAVES & GRASS accepted. Please do not leave plastic garbage bags of grass in the mulch pen. These plastic bags do not decompose and are not allowed by the Department of Environmental Quality. Also, please do not put leaves and grass in the tree pile nor add to the tree pile if it is burning or appears to be hot.

Items other than trees, leaves and grass are being brought into the area. If the tree disposal and mulch pen site are continued to be misused by anything other than trees, leaves and grass, the Village Board will be forced to severely limit the hours the area is open to residents. Thank you for your cooperation.
