Snow Removal Reminder

Village Code #8-201 states the sidewalks within the business district shall be cleaned within five hours after the cessation of a storm, unless the storm or fall of snow shall have taken place during the night, in which case the sidewalk shall be cleaned before 8:30 a.m. the following day.

Sidewalks within the residential areas of the Municipality shall be cleaned within 24 hours after the cessation of the storm. Thank you for your cooperation with snow removal.

Priority areas for village maintenance snow removal are the downtown area, fire barn and rescue unit building, school area and nursing home. After these areas have been cleared, then snow removal continues in the residential areas.

No building or structure or part of a building or structure shall be erected, constructed, reconstructed,

replaced, moved or structurally altered without first obtaining a zoning permit. This permit may be obtained from the Fillmore County Zoning web site: www.fillmorecounty.org or from the Village Clerk.
