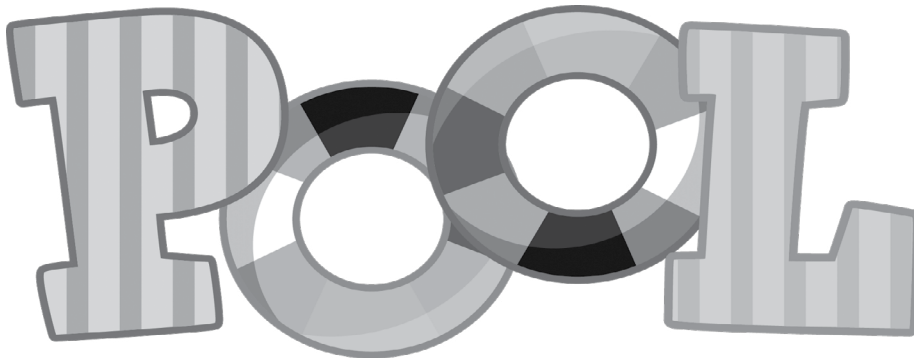

Dog licenses due in June

Dog licenses are due during June. All dogs inside and outside must be licensed.

The fees are \$2 for males and spayed females and \$4 for unspayed females.

Proof of current rabies shot is required at the time of licensing.

If you do not get your dog(s) licensed, the Village Marshal may charge you with having an unlicensed dog. If the occasion should arise, you could incur a fine of up to \$100, plus court costs of \$41.50.

Also, as you walk your dog around town, please be courteous to others and pick up fecal matter from your dog. Free waste bags are available at the Village Hall. Thank you for your cooperation.

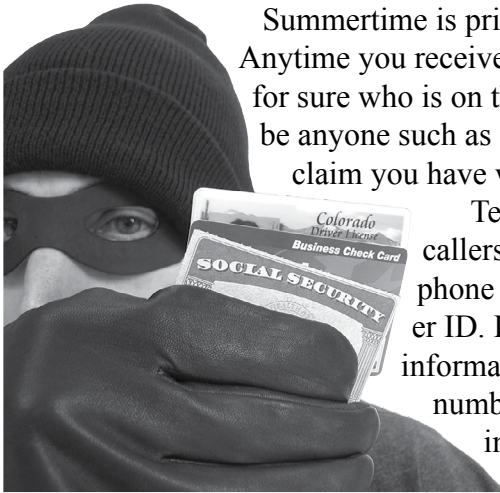




Marshal's Notes

Fraud awareness: Stay vigilant as summer is prime time for phone scams



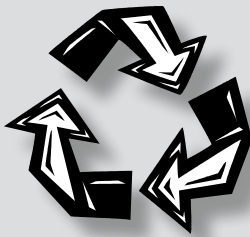
Summertime is prime time for telephone scams. Anytime you receive a phone call you do not know for sure who is on the other end. They can claim to be anyone such as a debt collector, IRS employee, or claim you have won a prize.

Technology exists that enables the callers to manipulate the name and phone number that displays on your Caller ID. It is best never to give out sensitive information such as your Social Security number, date of birth, bank account information, or credit card numbers to anyone who calls you.

Remember to recycle responsibly!

All residents are encouraged to take advantage of the compartmentalized recycling trailer located just south of the existing semi recycling trailer at the corner of 1st Ave. and E Street.

Please pay attention to the signage on each trailer to assist you with the proper placement of your recyclables.



Items for the compartmentalized recycling trailer include newspapers, magazines, tin cans, aluminum cans, #1 and #2 plastics and corrugated cardboard. Please flatten out your cardboard boxes.

Paperboard (cake mix box, etc.) is not accepted. Volunteers are still needed for transporting the trailer to Henderson to be emptied. Please call the library at (402) 268-6081 to volunteer. The entire process takes about two hours, round trip and the village will provide the hitch.

Mosquito spraying notice

The Village of Fairmont will be spraying for mosquitoes through September.

The Village will spray on Monday and Thursdays between 6 a.m. to midnight, weather permitting and as required. The chemical being used will be Evoluer. A material safety data sheet for this chemical is on file in the village clerk's office. The Village of Fairmont is hereby notifying all persons with medical conditions affected by this spraying to make necessary arrangements.

Tree Disposal Site Information

Tree disposal hours are Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m.- 8 p.m. Only trees, leaves and grass will be accepted. Please do not leave plastic garbage bags of grass in the mulch pen. These plastic bags do not decompose and are not allowed by the Department of Environmental Quality.

Also, please do not put leaves and grass in the tree pile nor add to the tree pile if it is burning or appears to be hot. Items other than trees, leaves and grass are being brought into the area. If the tree disposal and mulch pen site are continued to be misused by anything other than trees, leaves and grass, the Village Board will be forced to severely limit the hours the area is open to residents.
