Zoning Information

Just a reminder: No building or structure or part of a building or structure shall be erected, constructed, reconstructed, replaced, moved or structurally altered without first obtaining a zoning permit.

This permit may be obtained from the Fillmore County Zoning web site (www.fillmorecounty.org) by clicking on the "Offices" tab then clicking on the "Zoning Administrator" link or from the Village Clerk. Recycling update

All residents are encouraged to take advantage of the compartmentalized recycling trailer, located just south of the existing recycling semi-trailer at the corner of 1st Ave. and E Street.



Please pay attention to the signage on each trailer to assist you with the proper placement of your recyclable items.

Items for the compartmentalized recycling trailer include newspapers, magazines, tin cans, aluminum cans, #1 and #2 plastics and corrugated cardboard. Please flatten out your cardboard boxes. Paperboard (cake mix box, etc.) is not accepted.
