Tree dump information

Only trees, leaves, and grass are acceptable materials to dispose of at the tree dump. Please do not leave behind garbage bins, treated wood (this would include fence posts, pallets, etc.), or plastic garbage bag.

Offenses relating to dumping unauthorized materials could result in fines or permanent closure of the tree dump from the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy. Let's all do our best to keep this as a service offered to our community.
